Town Council Selects Rob Patterson as New Town Manager

- On January 31, 2024, the Mammoth Lakes Town Council announced after closed session that they have selected Rob Patterson as the next Town Manager.
- The appointment is subject to reaching a final agreement on compensation that will be discussed at the February 7, 2024, regular meeting as part of the employment agreement.
- Mr. Patterson has served as the Town's Administrative Services and Finance Director since July, 2016.
- After serving as the Town Manager for 10 years, Daniel C. Holler's last official day is February 29, 2024.

Significant Winter Storm Forecast for the Sierra - Be Snowsmart!

- [NWS Reno](#) has issued a [Winter Storm Warning](#) in effect from 10pm Saturday (2/3) to 10am, Monday (2/5).
- Snowfall rates of 1-3" per hour in the Sierra will lead to whiteout conditions and hazardous travel.
- Highest snowfall totals are favoring Mono County with a 90-95% probability of 3+ feet, with 4 feet along the Sierra crest.
- Call **800-427-ROAD** for current chain control restrictions or road conditions, listen to KMMT 106.5, Sierra Wave 92.5 or KIBS 100.7 FM, look for chain control signs throughout town or click [here](#) for a list of Taxi & Shuttle services, and other Snowsmart tips.
- The Mammoth Lakes Police Department is reminding citizens and visitors that from **November 1 through April 30**, no parking is allowed along all town streets unless otherwise noted.
