



Town Council Meeting Action Items – April 3, 2024

- Town Council held a Public Hearing and after public testimony, comments and deliberation, Council denied the appeal of the Planning and Economic Development Commission decision and affirmed the approval of Use Permit Application 23-002 for the Cell Tower located at 1574 Old Mammoth Road (Fire Station 2).
- Town staff presented the preliminary revenue budget for fiscal year 2024/25 to the Town Council, with a primary focus on the General Fund.
- Town Council voted to support a letter renaming a section of HWY 395 the “Dave McCoy Memorial HWY.”

Town Council Proclaims April 2024 as Fair Housing Month

- On April 3, the Town Council approved a proclamation declaring the month of April 2024 as Fair Housing Month in the Town of Mammoth Lakes.
- April 11, 2024, marks the 56th anniversary of the passage of the Fair Housing Act, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, which enunciates a national policy of Fair Housing that prohibits discrimination in housing based on race, color, religion, sex, familial status, national origin, and disability, and commits recipients of federal funding to affirmatively further fair housing in their communities.
- The Mammoth Lakes Board of Realtors and Eastern Sierra Community Housing are committed to highlight the Fair Housing Act by continuing to address discrimination in our community, to support programs that will educate the public about the right to equal housing opportunities for all, and to plan partnership efforts with other organizations to help assure every one of their right to fair housing.
- In addition, the National Association of Realtors Code of Ethics commits all realtors to provide equal professional services without discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, familial status, handicap, sexual orientation, gender identity, and national origin.

Town Council Approves Measure U Funds for local Arts, Culture and Recreation Organizations

- On April 3, 2024, Town Council approved a \$208,750 funding recommendation from Mammoth Lakes Recreation for the use of [Measure U](#) funds for projects and programs that support and enhance recreation, arts & culture, and mobility in the Mammoth Lakes area.
- Funding recipients include: Chamber Music Unbound (\$32,000), Clean Up the Lake (\$12,000), Eastern Sierra Arts Alliance (\$40,000), Eastern Sierra Avalanche Center (\$11,500), Eastern Sierra Community Chorus (\$8,500), Eastern Sierra Symphony (\$15,500), Friends of the Inyo (\$11,000), Mammoth Channel (\$7,000), Mammoth Mountain Ski Patrol Alumni (\$6,750), Mono Arts Council (\$44,000), Sierra Classic Theater (\$10,500) and the Valentine Eastern Sierra Reserve (\$10,000).

Lake Mary Road and Canyon Blvd. Undergrounding Work Begins April 10

- Southern California Edison is working with a contractor to install an underground duct system along Lake Mary Road and Canyon Boulevard that is scheduled to begin as soon as Wednesday, April 10.
- Although traffic will be maintained in both directions during construction, motorists may experience some delays. Construction is expected to take approximately 4-6 weeks.
