Town Council Meeting Agenda Items - November 6

- At 3:00pm the Town Council will participate in a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Dog Park located at 190 College Parkway in Mammoth Lakes.

Lakes Basin and Reds Meadow Road to Temporarily Close November 1

- In the interest of public safety due to the impending storm, the Inyo National Forest has decided to close the Lakes Basin area and Reds Meadow Road at 6:00pm today (11/1), or earlier depending on weather.
- National Weather Service Reno has posted a <u>Winter Weather Advisory</u> in effect from 11pm this evening (11/1) through 11am Saturday (11/2) with snow accumulations up to 1 inch for communities along Highway 395 and 2-6 inches above 8000 feet. Winds gusting as high as 50 mph over Sierra ridges.
- Road closures to wheeled, motorized vehicles include:
 - Lakes Basin at the Lake Mary Road gate
 - Old Mammoth Road at the lower gate
 - Reds Meadow Road at Minaret Vista
- The roads will remain open to pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The Inyo National Forest will work closely with its partners at the Town of Mammoth Lakes and reopen the roads as soon as it's deemed safe.

Mammoth Lakes Dog Park Ribbon Cutting Ceremony - November 6

- The Mammoth Lakes Town Council will celebrate the opening of the Town's first-ever community dog park with a ribbon cutting ceremony at 3:15pm on Wednesday, November 6, 2024.
- The community is invited to attend the official opening of the community dog park by dressing up their dog in a Halloween or festive costume. Prizes will be awarded for both small and large dogs, compliments of our local pet stores. Owners and their dogs are asked to arrive prior to the ribbon cutting ceremony at 3:00pm.
- The off-leash dog area is located on land owned by the Mammoth Lakes Foundation at 190 College Parkway and is approximately one acre in size. It includes a 5-foot perimeter fence, with a double-entry gate system and separate small and large dog areas. The dog park features 5,000 square feet of custom dog turf, 4 benches with water bowls in both the small and large dog areas. Parking is available for approximately 40 vehicles, and a restroom with water fountains and bottle filling stations is onsite. Leash posts are coming soon!

No Parking on Town Roads from November 1 - April 30

- The Mammoth Lakes Police Department reminds citizens and visitors that from **November 1 through April 30**, no parking is allowed along all town streets unless otherwise noted.
- Vehicles found parked in violation of these ordinances are subject to receiving a parking citation and/or in some cases, vehicles may be impounded at the owner's expense.

Fuelwood Collection Season Extended until November 30

- Inyo National Forest is extending personal fuelwood collection season from October 31 until November 30, 2024, or until winter weather no longer allows for collection without resource damage from vehicles.
- A permit is still required, and may be obtained as long as collection officers are staffed at the <u>Mammoth Lakes</u> Welcome Center.
