Town Council Begins Strategic Planning Series

- The Town Council kicked off its 2025 Strategic Planning Series (SPS) on November 6 by reviewing community comments and ideas from the Visioning Exercise at the Town's 40th Anniversary Celebration this past summer.
- The setting of clear and defined objectives allows staff and Town Council to allocate appropriate resources, define tactics and programs and to take actions that can be measured (and celebrated) over an established period of time.
- Incorporation of the Visioning Exercise comments into the Council's Strategic Priorities and Key Objectives for 2025 is just one step in the process. You can continue to make your voice heard every step of the way by attending meetings online or in-person throughout the series. The timeline for the SPS is as follows:
 - November 20, 2024 - Town Core Services Update
 - November & December – Review CIP projects, planning opportunities, and policy requests with both the Planning and Economic Development Commission and Parks and Recreation Commission.
 - December 4, 2024 - Review of current Town Council Strategic Priorities and Key Objectives
 - December 18, 2024 – Presentation and review of large policy items
 - January 2025 - Strategic Planning Workshop to discuss and adopt 2025 Strategic Priorities.
